1. Territorial Acknowledgement

2. Introductions (Co-Chair Pablo Ramirez)

Pablo introduced the Monterey Middle School PAC.

3. Administration Introductions and School Start Update (Principal Ken Andrews)

Ken presented the return to school: Overall feel for the return to school has been very positive. Teachers feel they have more flexibility, especially in terms of not being constrained by cohort groupings. There is a new music teacher and we're currently signing up music students for band, choir, and strings.

- Covid: the school follows PHO rules, and communication about possible Covid exposures at school is determined by Island Health. Field trips are now allowed, more clubs, extra-curriculum sports.
- Goals for the School will be discussed at the next PAC meetings.
- Athletic sports/sports equipment would be a priority
- Question about the class parent role: this role does not exist anymore now that teachers can communicate directly with parents through their class mailing list. Some parents were asking about the possibility of creating a class mailing list (for social events and overall class communications). It was agreed that the PAC should not be involved.

Action: Ken to look into the rules on parent's class mailing list, whether permission is required to share email addresses, etc.

5. Priorities for this year

A conversation about the priorities for the year for Monterey PAC:

• *Lunch program:* Ken has asked the School District Covid response committee about the rules to organize a lunch program this year. Shaza presented what has been done in the previous years

and the constraints to organize a program last year under Covid restrictions. Some other schools seem to have gone ahead with their fun food program.

Action: Ken to communicate to the PAC the answer from the School District re lunch programs rules for this year

• Fundraising

 Thrifty: Krista presented the new rules for the Thrifty fundraising programs. The PAC has to buy cards and sell them to the parents. Thrifty will pay 6% to the PAC for any card purchase at or above \$4,000.

Action: Krista to transfer the email she received from Thrifty to Fred



The idea of fundraising directly to the parents was raised. Krissy mentioned the contribution program that occurred at Willows in the past few years: Willows PAC asked for a minimum contribution per child (up to a maximum of \$80 per family). This was a very successful initiative (\$15,000 raised in 2018, \$17,000 in 2019).

6. 2021/2022 Budget Planning

- Ryan presented the budget's main revenues and expenses
- Still some uncertainties about the budget (will the lunch program happen and to which extend?)
- Ken mentioned the recurring need for athletic expenses (\$6,000)

- Staff continue to engage in ProD days focused on school-wide goals the September PD Day on assessment practices aimed at furthering student engagement and ownership of their learning and a Nov. PD Day planned around furthering students' physical wellness. Staff will be pursuing individual areas of professional growth (via district-wide and provincial conferences, etc.) at upcoming Oct PD Day
